Actigraphy and sleep diary for children and adolescents Information for patients, relatives and carers

What does this sleep study involve?

We will give your child a small watch-like device (actigraphy watch) to wear on their wrist that measures movement and light. They will wear this device for 1 or 2 weeks. At the same time, we will ask you to fill out the Sleep Diary we will give you. The information gathered from these will help the doctors better understand your child's sleep patterns and behaviours.

The study is not invasive; it does **not** involve any needles or medicines and it does **not** hurt.

You and your child will come to hospital for a 30 min appointment. We will give you the equipment and tell you how to fill in the diary. They will wear the actigraphy watch **at all times** at home for the next one to two weeks and fill in the Sleep Diary every morning and evening.

You will return the actigraphy watch and Sleep Diary to the same location you picked it up from. The physiologist will give you the time and date to do this at your first appointment.

Before your appointment

You should receive an email or letter to confirm the appointment date, time and location. It is important to arrive at the time on your letter.

If you are running late, cannot attend the appointment, or your child is unwell on the day of the appointment, then please phone as soon as possible to let us know. Please ring or message the administrator on 07881 851 536 Monday to Friday, 08.00 – 16.00.

When you arrive at the hospital

When you arrive, please:

- 1. Go to Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother (QEQM) building and take the lift to level 6
- 2. Press the call button outside the children's outpatient department and wait for a member of staff to let you in

We will then take you and your child to a private room for your appointment. We will explain how to use the equipment and how to fill out the Sleep Diary.

We will also give you an information sheet on how to use the equipment along with a phone number to call if you have any issues.

What happens after the study?

You will need to **return the actigraphy watch and Sleep Diary at the date and time agreed with the physiologist**. Please drop the equipment to the same place you got it from; with the reception staff of the children's outpatient department (6th floor QEQM building).

It can take one to two weeks to analyse and report the results of the study, because the actigraphy watch collects a large amount of information. The final report will be sent to your doctor and they will talk to you about the results in your next appointment.
