After your pleural biopsy

Information for patients, relatives and carers

Introduction

This leaflet provides information about recovering after a pleural biopsy. Please read this information carefully and if you have any questions, please contact your clinical team.

What happens next?

Today (.....) you have had a pleural biopsy of your RIGHT / LEFT side at ST. MARY'S / CHARING CROSS HOSPITAL. This is generally a very safe and well-tolerated procedure but the following information may be helpful and reassuring:

- You may have some mild pain around where the needle entered the pleural space (the lining of the lung). This should settle in a day or two but you may wish to take paracetamol for the pain.
- You have also had some fluid removed (aspirated) from the lining of your lung. Your breathing should improve following the aspiration if we have drained a significant amount of fluid from the lung (over 500mls), but sometimes people experience more difficulty breathing with a troublesome cough temporarily. This should settle within 24 hours, and is most likely to be the result of the lung re-inflating.
- The risk of acquiring an infection from the procedure is very small indeed, but if you become unwell with fevers, breathlessness and lethargy in the days or weeks following the procedure, you are advised to see your doctor or contact the pleural team.

Washing

You are advised to keep the area dry for 24 hours. A small dressing will have been applied to the needle entry site and this can be removed after 24 hours.
